

RESIDENCE HALL PROFILES

To complement the academic mission of the college, each residence hall maintains a living-learning environment, providing accommodations that are suitable for both academic and social pursuits. There are a minimal amount of single rooms available; therefore, students should anticipate living with at least one other student. Such living arrangements necessitate flexibility and compromise. It is the hope of the Department of Residence Life that students can negotiate this environment with an open mind and a willingness to maturely resolve any conflicts that might arise.

Each building is designated as smoke-free in all rooms, common areas, and on the front steps. Additionally, all first-year student residence halls are dry, meaning that, regardless of age, residents are not allowed to have alcohol in the residence halls at any time. Returning students may apply for Personal Consumption Privileges while living in Commonwealth Hall at 260/262 Commonwealth Avenue. The requirements for that privilege are stated in the Resident Student Handbook issued to each student upon moving into the residence halls.

Each of the halls is a charming Victorian townhouse with a unique profile and distinctive traits. Below you will find more information on the details and character of each residence hall:



Crowninsheld Hall:

- Location: 164 Marlborough Street
- Capacity: Approximately 30 male and female students
- Staffing: Two Resident Assistants
 - Building is overseen by the Assistant Director of Residence Life.
- Features an architecturally stunning front foyer.
- Computer lab and study lounge are located on the first floor.
- Social lounge is located on the garden level.

Tudor Hall:

- Location: 125/127 Commonwealth Avenue
- Capacity: Approximately 30 female students in the 125 section and 35 male and female students in the 127 section
 - Female students looking to live in an all-female hall should select this residence and request placement in the 125 section.
- Staffing: Three Resident Assistants, One Graduate Assistant
 - The building is overseen by the Director of Residence Life.
- This building houses the campus dining hall.
- Computer lab and study lounge are located on the second floor of the 125 section.
- Social lounge is located on the first floor.



Windsor Hall:

- Location: 181 Commonwealth Avenue
- Capacity: Approximately 45 male and female students
- Staffing: Two Resident Assistants, One Graduate Assistant
 - Building is overseen by the Assistant Director of Residence Life.
- Features a cozy den that serves as the lounge on the first floor.
- Computer lab and study lounge are located on the garden level.

Commonwealth Hall:

- Location: 260/262 Commonwealth Avenue
- Capacity: Approximately 65 male and female students
- Staffing: Four Resident Assistants
 - The building is overseen by the Resident Director.
- This building is reserved for our upperclass students.
- This building houses "The Underground." Our social lounge on campus available to all students that includes a full kitchen set up including stove top, oven, and big screen TV.
- Computer lab and study lounge are located on the garden level.
- There are two social lounges available on the first floor.
