RACE, GENDER, and ETHNICITY ELECTIVES: The following courses: CRI 322, SOC 208, SOC 302, SOC 309, SOC, and SOC 401, for which the student has the necessary prerequisites, may be used as Race, Gender and Ethnicity electives.

JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION ELECTIVE: The following courses: CRI 208, CRI 218, CRI 306, and CRI 316, for which the student has the necessary prerequisites, may be used as a Justice Administration Elective.

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SOCIAL SCIENCE ELECTIVE: Any courses with the prefix SOC, PSY, HIS, ECO, ANT and REL not listed above, for which the student has the necessary prerequisites, may be used as a Social Science elective.

LITERATURE ELECTIVE: Any courses not listed above with the prefix ENG, LIT as well as REL 200 and CRI 316, for which the student has the necessary prerequisites, may be used as a Literature elective.

HUMANITIES ELECTIVE: Any courses not listed above with the prefix ENG, LIT, REL, AHI, CIN, COM, PHI, or MUS, for which the student has the necessary prerequisites, may be used as a Humanities elective.
